JONES'S NON-NEGOTIABLES

Physicality & Athleticism

Players must be physically imposing and match the relentless intensity of the Championship. Jones targets athletes first — technical ability comes second if the engine isn't there.

Maximum Work Rate

Jones demands man to man pressing without the ball. Every player must cover ground, close down and win second balls. No hiding.

Positive Attitude — Zero Ego

Humble, coachable, and team-first. Jones has said repeatedly: one bad apple can poison the dressing room. Character is screened as hard as ability.

Something to Prove

Jones never recruits players who have 'made it'. He targets hungry players — either on the rise or fighting back from adversity — who need Charlton as much as Charlton needs them.

Played at the Level or Higher

Every recruit must have played in the Championship or above or demonstrated clear readiness. Jones does not use senior minutes to develop — that is what the academy is for.

CLUB PHILOSOPHY & VALUES

Development of Young Players

A clear pathway from Academy to first team. Jones handed a debut to 18-year-old Ibrahim Fullah in 25/26 and has shown faith in academy products such as Tyreece Campbell and Miles Leaburn.

Front-Foot, High-Intensity Football

Chairman Gavin Carter appointed Jones specifically to get Charlton 'playing on the front foot with passion and intensity'. The style is non-negotiable at board level.

Long-Term Project, Not a Quick Fix

Jones signed a new five-year contract in June 2025 after promotion. The club has a stable identity — Jones has overseen 46 points in 21 games at his peak — built to sustain, not spike.

Set-Piece as a Structural Weapon

Jones is meticulous on set pieces — 7 set-piece goals in 25/26 season, 3rd best in the Championship. It is drilled every week and is a deliberate competitive edge.

Defensive Discipline

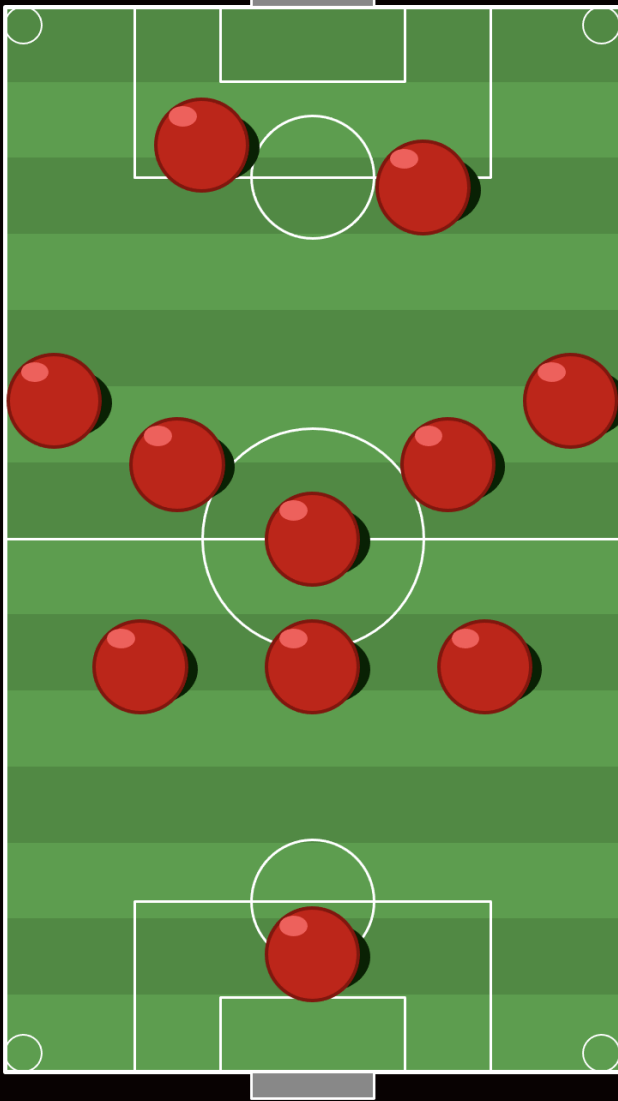
Charlton's opponents averaged just 0.082 xG per shot — among the best in the division. 'People who want to defend' is a Jones recruitment mantra alongside attacking quality.

Ambition Beyond the Championship

Jones: 'This is not a club that would satisfy itself with just being in the second tier.' The whole ecosystem — training ground investment, recruitment model, fan base — is pointed upward.

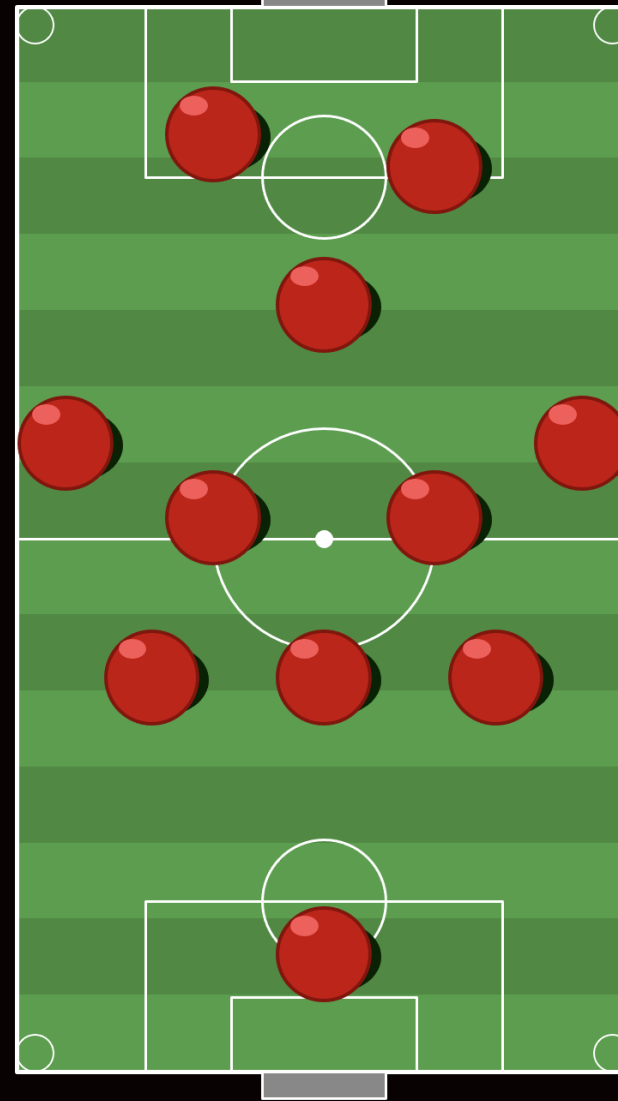

BACK 3 & BUILD-UP

- Wide CBs (LCB & RCB) must be athletic — ability to carry ball out
- Both wide CBs bring ball forward to initiate attacks
- CCB — Lloyd Jones is integral; he organises and dominates aerial and ground duels.
- Defenders look for Carey or Campbell as creative threats after winning ball
- If it's not on diagonal ball to target man for knockdown or knock-on

STRIKER & ATTACKING PLAY

- Will go long to target men first — win ball in the middle third
- Campbell (left ST) — plays on left side, beats man with pace 1v1
- Striker partnership: one holds & pins, one drops to link or spin in behind. Both play on last line.
- Carey / CAM is the creative threat CBs look to find on second phase
- If creative pass not on: team plays diagonal long balls to target men for knock-ons

WING-BACKS — ATTACKING ROLE

- Primary outlet for crosses — must whip quality balls into the box
- Push to the byline to create wide overloads and crossing angles
- Athleticism essential — recover quickly to defensive shape on turnover

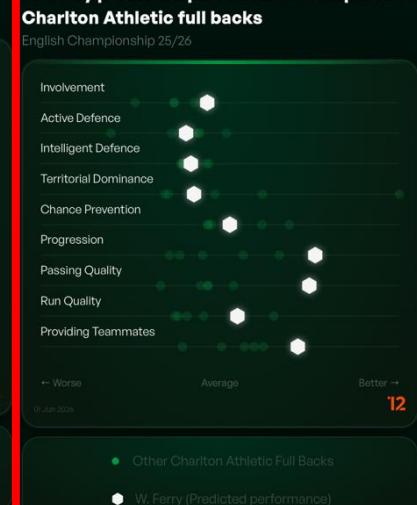
Predicted performance of Will Ferry



Charlton Athletic's style of play

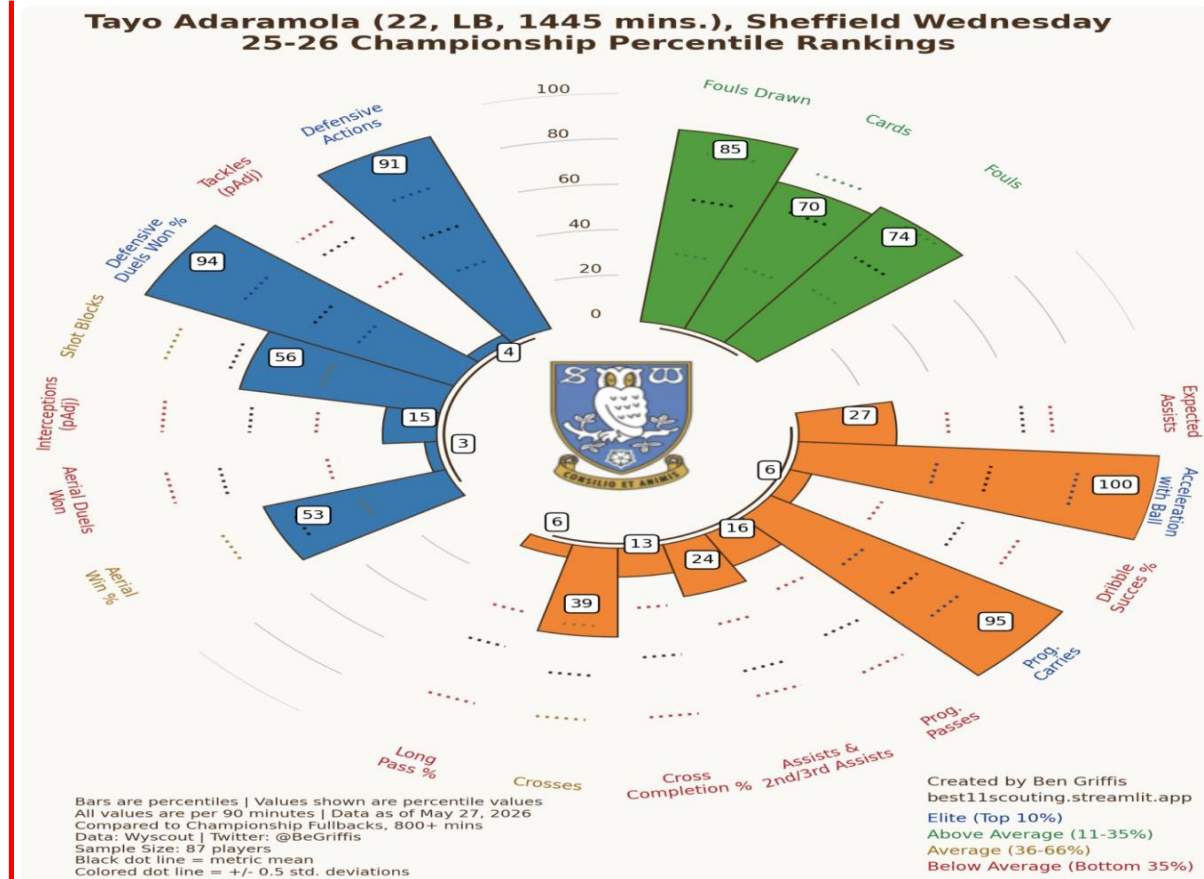


W. Ferry predicted performance compared to Charlton Athletic full backs
