I am enclosing herewith my order No. 314 for 45 square yards of battle ship linoleum for shipment to this institution on the enclosed bill of lading, to be furnished under Item No 3860 (a)(3) General Schedule of Supplies.

I note in the above catalogue that tan is the only color specified. This linoleum will be used on the floor where fine particles of gold will be dropped and if a dark green, or some other color that would be in contrast to the color of gold could be supplied at the contract price and under the conditions of your contract, I would be very glad to have you do so. If your contract, however, includes only the tan color, I do not wish, of course, to ask you to make any change therein that would not be entirely consistent therewith.
