

RE-CAPTURE

Guidelines for Recapture Photography Project

- Photographs should represent what recovery from an eating disorder means to you.
- Photographs can be in colour or black and white- it's up to you!
- Entrants must be aged 14 to 26 years old.
- Photographs submitted must be your own original work
- No photographs containing food, thin bodies, other triggering images or anything else deemed as inappropriate or offensive will be accepted.
- If the photograph is of someone you know then you must be able to provide evidence that they have given their permission for the photograph to be used.
- Photographs must be at least 300 dpi, the higher the better so remember to use the high quality setting on your camera or phone! Please make sure the file size is no more than 3MB.
- When you submit your photograph it will be made available to view via an online gallery. You can choose to do so anonymously or you can be named as the photographer. You can tell us which you would prefer on the application form.
- By submitting a photograph you are giving your consent for your image to be used for promotional purposes by Young Scot and Re-capture during Eating Disorder Awareness Week 2012 and by Young Scot thereafter.

Terms and Conditions

1. This Project is open to residents of the Scotland aged 14 to 26 years old.
2. It is a condition of entry that all rules are accepted as final and that the entrant agrees to abide by these rules.
3. Entries should be submitted by via email to re-capture@youngscot.org. Entries must be labelled with the entrant's name and image files must be at least 300 dpi and between 1MB and 3MB. Entrants should include their own name, address and telephone number.
4. All entries must be received by the advertised closing time and date.
5. All photographs submitted must be the work of the individual submitting them. It is the responsibility of each entrant to ensure that any photographs they submit have been taken with the permission of the subject.
6. By submitting the photograph, entrants grant Young Scot and Re-capture the rights to display the photograph on an online gallery and to use the images for promotional purposes during Eating Disorder Awareness Week (EDAW). Entrants also grant the rights to Young Scot for use after EDAW.
7. Photographs containing images deemed to be obscene, defamatory, indecent, lewd, pornographic, violent, abusive, insulting, threatening, discriminatory or otherwise inappropriate will not be accepted.
